Ames Laboratory

Ames Laboratory, a U.S. Department of Energy national laboratory located on campus, is home to many unique research instruments and capabilities, including the Materials Preparation Center and Sensitive Instrument Facility.

Center for Excellence in the Arts and Humanities

As its central mission, CEAH provides internal grant support and creates programs that will strengthen the richness, productivity, national and international visibility, and continuing impact of faculty research.

Center for Survey Statistics and Methodology

The Center for Survey Statistics and Methodology (CSSM) provides a wide range of survey research services to ISU researchers, such as sample and questionnaire design, data weighting/analysis, and all forms of data collection - web surveys, mail surveys, telephone and in-person interviews, focus groups, and observational data collection.

Child Welfare Research and Training Project

The CWRTP is a collaboration between ISU faculty and staff, graduate assistants, Iowa citizens, and state and local Department of Human Services employees and supervisors who ensure that Iowa's children and families receive services and care informed by best practices that lead to safety and overall well-being.

Conference Planning and Management

Conference Planning & Management (CPM) assists researchers and grant recipients with conferences/site visits with services such as event budgeting, meals, room sets, participant materials, travel/airport shuttles, hotel blocks, and more!

Family Transitions Data Lab

As a result of thirty years of experience, the FTP Data Lab can provide you the opportunity to conduct social science research employing a variety of data collection and data processing techniques that can be utilized with participants across the lifespan.

Grants Hub

The Grants Hub works to diversify and increase the research portfolio of the University, by assisting new and experienced ISU researchers with finding funding, proposal development, interdisciplinary team science, award review, and project management.

Iowa State University Foundation

Iowa State University Foundation units helps faculty secure and steward funding for a variety of needs, including research, student support, programs, and special projects.

Iowa State University Library

Librarians provide in-depth research assistance; answer questions about copyright, impact measurement, data management plans, open access publishing, and open educational resources; help with citation software such as EndNote or Mendeley; digitize and archive ISU-produced publications; and help increase the visibility of your scholarship.

Laboratory Animal Resources/Attending Veterinarian

The Attending Veterinarian works with researchers to provide quality care for animals used in research, teaching, and testing by helping to develop best care practices for any animals owned by Iowa State University. The Laboratory Animal Resources (LAR) unit includes additional veterinarians and technicians who help enhance your research and teaching by providing quality and compliant care for laboratory animals.

Office for Responsible Research

The Office for Responsible Research provides administrative services for Iowa State University's compliance program for projects involving animals, human subjects, biohazards, and radiation.

Office of Biotechnology

As part of its research mission, the Office of Biotechnology administers ten fee-for-service instrumentation facilities, offers courses in molecular biology techniques, supports biotechnology-related conferences and speakers, and maintains an online searchable database of Iowa State's biotechnology researchers.

Office of Economic Development & Industry Relations, ISU Research Park, ISU Startup Factory

The Office of Economic Development and Industry Relations connects companies and individuals with university capabilities and expertise in business and technical assistance, research and development, facilities, and workforce development. The ISU Research Park provides established companies and startups with a network, space, and connections to grow their business. The ISU Startup Factory in the Research Park provides an avenue for students, faculty, and staff to create businesses.

Office of Research Integrity

The Office of Research Integrity fosters a culture of ethical research practice through Iowa State University's conflicts of interest in research, export controls, unmanned aircraft, and research integrity programs.

Office of Sponsored Programs Administration

The Office of Sponsored Programs Administration (OSPA) helps researchers with submitting proposals and establishing awards, and with amending projects funded by federal, state, other government, and non-profit organizations.

OIPTT - Industry Contacts

OIPTT Industry Contracts negotiates and signs awards and amendments for projects funded by industry sponsors and commodity groups, as well as negotiating and signing Material Transfer and Non-Disclosure Agreements.

OIPTT - Technology Commercialization

The Technology Commercialization Team of OIPTT evaluates, protects, and licenses intellectual property developed by researchers at Iowa State University.

Research Institute for Studies in Education

RISE is a team of interdisciplinary scholars who serve as external evaluators, provide project planning/development consultation, and work with researchers on proposal preparation, submission, and post-award activities.

Sponsored Programs Accounting

Sponsored Programs Accounting provides post-award services to Iowa State researchers, administrative offices, and sponsors. We establish account numbers, collect funds from sponsors, issue payments to subcontractors, submit financial reports, and advise on sponsor regulations and fiscal allowability.

University Translational Research Network (U-TuRN)

U-TuRN is a translational research network designed to facilitate connections and collaborations among researchers, extension leaders, and community partners in order to advance the dissemination of evidence-based policies, practices and programs that help promote healthy living in Iowans.
